Barkhetri College was established in 1983. Salient Features of Four years Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP)


- **1. Duration:** It is a 4-year degree programme under New Education Policy's (NEP's) FYUGP.
- 2. Exits and Entries: Students can choose to exit from the program thrice after one year, after two year and after three years.

Note After exiting in the middle, Students can enter the programme again and start from where they left

Every student who wants to exit before 3 years into the programme, MUST complete an additional Vocational Course of 4 credits.

- **3. Honours and Majors:** In FYUGP, a Bachelor's Degree with Major after **3** years and a Degree with Major & Honours is awarded after 4 years.
- 4. **Progression:** Students exiting the FYUGP after 3 years will need to take admission into the first year of a Master's Programme (which is a 2 year programme). However, after completing 4 year FYUGP programme, students will take admission into the second year of a Master's programme.



5. After completing the Master's Programme, Students can take admission into Doctoral Programme leading to Degree of PhD. However, If a student is exceptionally good, one can directly take admission into a Doctoral programme right after the FYUGP, bypassing the Master's programme.


New Unique Features of FYUGP Open Core Credits

From fourth to Sixth semester, Students will have time for 4 optional open core credits per semester, which one can utilise to study either of the Major or two Minors. **They can also come handy, if one had changed a Minor subject in between**.

Double Major

Students can convert one of the Minors to a second Major by the time one completes 3 or 4 years of study by taking some extra online courses (from designated sources only) related to the Minors. In this case, one will have a Bachelor's Degree with Double Major.




Core course description

In this case, a student takes a Major subject with minimum 15 core courses and two Minor subjects with a minimum of 3 courses each over a period of three years. Apart from these, the student also needs to take 3 Core courses during Semesters 4-6 where s/he can pick any of the three core subjects s/he has already studied.

Skill Courses

A student can take any skill course offered by the respective institution during Semesters1-3.

Prerequisites, Requirements & Constraints

The **prerequisites** are subjects that a student *must* have studied (and passed) in an earlier level of education (usually Class XI & XII) in order to be able to choose a subject.

In contrast to the prerequisites, **requirements** are certain conditions attached to some core subjects. For example, if a student wants to study Botany as a core subject, Chemistry as another core subjects has to be chosen. This is a 'requirement'. However, if one chooses Chemistry, there is no requirements.

Constraints refer to the maximum number of subjects a student can choose from a particular subject group. For example, one can choose a maximum of any two subjects from the group.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Eligibility: Candidates, who have passed the HSSLC examination of the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC) or any other equivalent examination, are eligible for admission into the three years/four years undergraduate programme, subject to the availability of seats.

Admission is given strictly on merit and governed by the college admission rules.

- The decision of the admission committee regarding admission will be final. The college reserves the right to refuse admission to any one without assigning any reason thereof. Candidates selected must get themselves admitted on the very day of interview by making necessary payments, failing which they will forfeit their claim.
- An application form which is not submitted on or before the stipulated date or not completely filled-up shall not be considered for admission. All candidates seeking admission must appear for interview on the scheduled date in person or through his/her representative.
- Candidates shall have to produce the following documents in original along with self attached photostat copies at the time of Admission
 - Original Admit card of HSLC examination for age verification
 - Original Marksheet and Certificate of the last examination passed.
 - Two copies of passport size photographs of the candidate.
 - Caste certificate (OBC/MOBC/SC/ST)
 - Proficiency certificate regarding extra-curricular activities where necessary (Certificates below district level representative will not be entertained).
 - Pass certificate from the Principal of the institution last attended by the candidate.
 - Gap certificate (if necessary) only from the Head of the institution last attended or an affidavit from the NOTARY in Assam or any State.
 - Differently abled certificate showing percentage of disability obtained from Govt medical officer.

Applicability for free studentship

Category of Students eligible under the scheme:

- Students whose parental income is less than Rs. 2.00 lakhs from all sources will be eligible to avail this scheme (applications under govt. fee waiver scheme)
- If either of the parent of the student is working in the state govt./Central govt/ Semi govt./ State or Central Govt. undertaking, such students shall not be eligible under this scheme.

Proof of income/documents required for the free studentship


- ➤ An income certificate from Local Revenue Circle officer.

Such form shall be devised by the concerned Registrars/Principals. If such a declaration is found to be false, the admission shall be cancelled and fees shall be realized from such students, otherwise his/her admission will be forfeited.



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INFRASTRUCTURE AND FACILITIES OFFERED

- 1. Admission: Only online admission facility is available Through SAMARTH portal.
- **2.** College Administration: Administrative activities are fully digitalized and automated with office management software. Activities like admission and registration of students, maintenance of accounts etc. are done digitally.
- 3. Classroom and Laboratories: Adequate number of classrooms with spacious area are available. Two well equipped laboratories with sufficient spaces are available for the department of Geography and Education. For the science stream, there are four well equipped and well maintained sophisticated laboratories.
- 4. College Library: The central library of the college "Rashid Ahmed Memorial Library" contains more than 10,000 books and has spacious reading spaces, which can accommodate more than 100 students at a time for self study. Apart from books, the library has 3 nos of Magazines, 2 nos of Journals, 4 nos of Newspapers and more than 500 back volumes of journals. Library automation works is also initially started with the help of ILMS soul 3.0
- 5. Departmental Library: Apart from college central library, the students can also use the books of the department libraries.
- 6. Computer laboratory: A computer laboratory consisting of around 30 branded computers loaded with windows latest version is also available in the college. The computers are connected to LAN through a central server.
- 7. Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC): This cell provide service towards the all around upgradation of all academic and administrative activities of the college in a planned manner. Currently, the cell is being operated by Dr. Utpal Kalita.
- 8. Information & Career Guidance Cum Placement Cell: This cell endeavors to make students aware of employment opportunities and competitive examinations organized by different Govt. and Non Govt. agencies. The cell operates under the guidance of an experienced and resourceful teacher
- **9. Auditorium:** A sophisticated auditorium with a capacity to accommodate approximately 500 persons, fitted with latest equipment is available.
- **10.Common room for students:** The Boy's and Girls' common rooms are provided with adequate facilities.
- **11. Uninterrupted electric supply:** The college has one Diesel Generator sets with 13KVA capacities which provide uninterrupted power supply.
- **12.Canteen:** The college canteen remains open during class hours that provide hygienic food at nominal rate.
- **13. Smart classes:** We have set up two smart classrooms and three ICT classrooms to provide benefits of modern and digital modes of teaching to students.
- 14. Drinking water: Purified drinking water is available at the college campus.
- **15.Feedback and Attendance:** Feedback of the students are maintained online and attendance is maintained offline.
- **16.Facilities for PWD:** Our college has ramps, wheel chairs, walking chair, walking stick, separate toilet etc. in all buildings for differently able students.

- **17. Sports and cultural activities:** There is fine playground for outdoor games. All sports and cultural activities are officially arranged in the college during January/February of every year.
- **18.** NSS, NCC & Scout and Guide: Students at Barkhetri College also get the opportunity to develop his/her personality and shape their attitude towards life by joining programs like National Service Scheme (NSS), National Cadet Corps (NCC) and Scout & Guide.
- **19. Alumni Association:** The alumni association of the college holds periodic meetings among its members and keeps in touch with the principal about the various activities of the college.
- **20. Barkhetri College Students' union:** Student's union represents the students of the college, which report any kind of problem faced by students and try to resolve with the help of the authorities.
- **21. Research and Development cell:** This cell is constituted as per the latest UGC guidelines, which assess the research activities of the College Faculty members.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Attendance rules

Attendance in class is strictly compulsory. A student must not attend less than 75% of the lectures delivered in each subject to become eligible for appearing in University examination. A student will be penalized if he/she fails to attend 75% of classes and will be considered as a non collegiate student. A non collegiate student will have to pay a fine of Rs. 3000 along with supporting documents (for not being able to present 75% classes) to appear in the final examination.

College uniform

College uniform is compulsory for all students for all purposes inside the college campus.

- (1) For Boys: White shirt (Full) and Black long pant, Maroon colour Sweater/Blazer in the winter
- (2) For Girls: White Kameez and Black colour Churidar/Shalawar & Dupatta, Maroon Colour sweater in the winter.

Note: i) T-shirt, Jeans and jackets will not be allowed. ii) Traditional dresses are allowed only in festival celebration days.

Student's Identity Card

Every student will be issued an identity card at the time of admission. The card which is non-transferable contains information about the holder, such as Name, Session, Class, Roll no., combination of subjects, etc. It also contains passport size photograph of the student duly endorsed by the Principal. It is mandatory for every student to carry the identity card with him/her so that it can be produced whenever necessary.

Maintenance of Discipline

The students must maintain discipline on the college premises. They must not loiter aimlessly within the College campus. Students must spend their spare time/off periods in a way that will not cause any interference with the work of others. Bikeholders must obtain gate passes from the Principal. Cell phones are strictly prohibited inside college campus, otherwise may face disciplinary action. Students should, in their own interest, read every day all notices displayed on the notice boards as well as in college website from time to time, and be fully aware of the information displayed thereon. Smoking and sewing of ghutkas are strictly prohibited within the college campus

Internal examination (compulsory)

Students should attend Sessional examinations, held for each subject of during each semester. Internal examinations are held generally after two months of the start of classes in both odd and even semester. Obtaining the pass marks in sessional/internal examination is compulsory. Internal assessment is done on the basis of students attendance and performance in the sessional examination.

Punishable acts for Indiscipline

- 1) An act which causes destruction or defacing or loss of the property of the college and breaking into the premises of the college
- An act of insubordination into or rude behaviour and use of impertinent language towards the Principal or any faculty member of the college or nonteaching staff.
- An act that disrupts the smooth functioning of the college or environment conducive to the pursuit of knowledge or harmonious relationship between different group of students.
- 4) Any student found to be involved in ragging is liable to be expelled from the college and in addition may undergo imprisonment and fine, as per sections laid down in the Indian panel code.
- 5) An act of unruly and disorderly behaviour at any competitions, sports, cultural activities or other social or educational programmes organized by the college.
- 6) Smoking, consumption of alcohol, intoxicants and narcotic drugs, eve-teasing.
- 7) Collection of funds for any programme, picnic, excursion, project or activity without prior written permission of the appropriate authority.
- 8) Use of the name or address of the college or its officials or other authorities for making any representation on behalf of any student or a group of students to any public authority responsible for the management of the affairs of the college.
- 9) An act which interferes with the personal liberty of another person or subjects another to dignity, or involves physical violence or use of abusive language.
- 10) Generally, any other act of indiscipline which, in the opinion of the Principal of the college, is unbecoming a student.
