ACADEMIC AUDIT OF BARKHETRI COLLEGE: OVERALL OBSERVATIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This academic audit report is the result of our observations and interactions with faculty, the college IQAC and the Principal, as well as the data submitted. There was one general overview given by the IQAC coordinator followed by detailed presentations from 15 of the 16 departments (Physics is beginning from the coming session).

The College has a stated vision for the development of higher education in the Barkhetri region where it is located and this seemed a laudable goal, reflected in the adoption of two schools and a village, as well as the resource-sharing and exchange- MOUs that have been signed with two nearby colleges. These are activities that should be sustained. The IQAC also flagged its mission to create a conducive environment for curricular and extra-curricular activities for the physical and intellectual well being of students and teachers.

Positives

The College has considerable potential in physical and human resources and it is felt that with the recent appointment of a regular Principal (he has been in office for one year) these will be more effectively utilized.

There is a sincere and hardworking community of teachers who are keen to make available the best possible education to students. The younger faculty in some of the disciplines, and particularly in Maths, Botany, Chemistry and Zoology, have PhDs as well as publications in good journals, demonstrating ongoing engagement with their areas of specialization and are interested in both teaching and research. They should be encouraged to apply for research projects to support further research and develop the laboratory resources.

The Library is fairly large, with reading rooms for students and teachers and a reasonable number of books. It also has a regular Librarian and the requisite staff. It is in the process of digitizing its holdings and is also planning to sign up for the N-List. These are essentials for a modern library.

Areas where more effort is needed

While many of the faculty members are participating in seminars/conferences and attending FDPs, we feel that the output in the form of publications is not entirely satisfactory. This is evident from the quality of the books and journals in which such articles find place.

The plans for teaching that were submitted by all have considerable room for improvement. They should be more specific, with clear break up of topics to indicate how these will be taught over the actual working days likely to be available. With the FYUGP of the NEP beginning from the next session this is an area that needs to be seriously addressed.

Recommendations

The considerable physical resources of the College, some of which are bringing in revenue, can also be harnessed for academic purposes. Since the college has a large bamboo grove, it might explore the possibility of tying up with the North East Cane and Bamboo Development Council (NECBDC)(located at Byrnihat) to explore proper utilization of this resource, as well as consider CBDC's training programs for interested students and faculty.

There was mention of sharing of laboratory equipment among departments. We would suggest development of a full-fledged lab sharing initiativethrough establishment of a common facility that may also be made available to the two colleges with which there are ongoing exchange programs. Similar common use possibilities could also be discussed with these two colleges.

The Library needs to be regularly enhanced. The procurement of high-quality textbooks and reference books that may not be possible for teachers or students to individually purchase should be the goal.

The college might consider using its extensive land area for creating sports facilities for track and field events and other sports that will contribute to the all round development of the academic community.

The College needs to design a comprehensive academic Master Plan for the next 15 years.
